Dunk has been hangin' around some, but he brought some ice cream and pop yesterday.

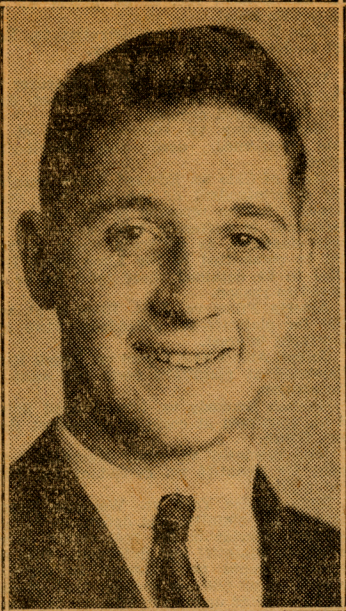
The stadium is open and Mr. Stone must not be going to fix the courts because he put the nets up yesterday and the grass is three inches high. Maybe he wants lawn courts.

We got some more cards from you this morning and you said on one it was nice to get something at mail-call and then I was sorry I hadn't written you often, but I didn't want to make you home sick or wasn't there any chance of that? maybe this one won't get to you before you start home but any how I'll hope it does.

Everything's going along about as usual here, no excitement - things unusually quiet without you around. Dad & I are completely deserted in the evenings now. Ruth & I went to see "See Here, Pvt. Hargrove" Wed. and it surely was good. I haven't laughed so hard at a movie in a long time. You'll have to see it when it comes back again.

The chickens are doing O.K. except for one which I think Dad topped last night for me 'cause it couldn't stand on its feet. They keep asking where

2. you are and don't seem to understand what I mean by Berj's State.

I hoed my small veg. garden this morning. It's a lovely day. Also pulled some weeds and tied up the grape vine to the Kitchen window. I wanted to get those gladiolus bulbs planted but got too tired and figured you'd need something to keep you busy next week.

Tues. night Mrs. Barton died. She had another stroke Mon. eve. and the funeral is today. So bad but she hadn't been herself for a long time, altho' she was out in the yard in a chair Mon. eve watching him hoe the garden. Will sure miss her.

We had letters from both Bob & Dave on Tues. Also a picture of Dave. Bob said they'd been playing football ball things. Dave had gotten some more cookies and candy.

3. Gene's talking about getting a job at the incinerator till he has to go. \$10 a week and all he can eat — or did I tell you that? He's just working part-time at store. Slept in this morning & will go down soon — 11:30 a.m.

Last night when Dad & I were coming back from the funeral home we saw Jim Driscoll & another fellow sitting alongside the road with a bunch of women — not young girls — so we couldn't figure it out. Looked like they'd hiked somewhere & were resting. Will have to explain that. Maggie got you card. Also Grandma got hers.

We'll expect you Sun. eve sometime, then. You can call us when you get in.
