
YOUNG BUCKS SILVER BUCKS



The Silver Bucks put the blitz on, and Quick Kyle forced the quarterback into the waiting arms of Captain Crunch Kevin on the Young Bucks' ten yard line. Jolt'n Jim and the Silver offense struck quickly with a flag pattern to Hammerin Hank, and it was all tied up. After the conversion failed, the score stood at 6-6.

It looked like the Young Bucks would answer with their second scoring drive when Monsterman Mark hauled in a first down throw from Wild Bill that was spotted at the Silver Bucks five yard line. But the first two scores were all the points the two offenses would generate as the defenses took over. Nifty Neal alertly rushed up from his safety position and picked off a pass in the flats to get the Silver Bucks out of trouble. It was time for the defenses to trade punches as the Dog's defensive cornerback Monsterman Mark intercepted a long pass. Then Fearless Fred rose up for the Silver defense with back to back sacks. When the Young Bucks punt was dropped and recovered by Monsterman Mark, it looked like the Young Buck offense would score again. This time Big Don picked the ball off from his middle linebacker position to deny the Young Bucks once again. Appropriately the half ended with an interception by Bubby Bundy.

Mark Monsterman Hitchins wraps up a Silver Buck quarterback in a doggy sack.




This early TD throw from Wild Bill to Too Small Dale was the first score.


The second half started out looking like the Young Buck offense had made the necessary blocking adjustments. Bubby Bundy drove the team down to the one yard line on third down. But the Silver defense put up a tremendous goal line stand. Knowing the Young Bucks would try to run the ball up the gut, Jamm'n Jake stuffed the middle of the line and forced the ball carrier to run outside where Fearless Fred stopped him for a loss. The fifth down pass was broken up by Hammerin Hank, so the ball went over to the Silver offense on downs. Neither offense could get things going and the crowd was worried that the game might go into overtime. But on the fourth series of the half, Ski'n Ian swooshed in from his defensive end position and sacked the Silver Buck quarterback. It appeared to be a safety, but the ruling was that the force of Ian's sack forced the quarterback into the end zone. The ball was spotted at the five. The score remained tied, and again the offenses sputtered on two different possessions.

When it was apparent to both teams that the offenses were hurting, the Silver and Dog defenses determined to take over the game and score. Four back to back interceptions followed: first Hammerin Hank, then Bubby Bundy, and then Crazy Legs Lewis. But the most damaging one was by Game Breaker Bruce, who slipped up from his free safety position to pick off a down and out. Bruce raced into the end zone, off the field, and down the trail à la Bo Jackson. The dog brothers were inspired. This time Junkyard Grover ran it in for the last score of the game. The Silver Buck offense went into their two minute offense but came up short as Dandy Dean was stopped five yards away from a score as time expired.

In the end the Silver defense was sterling, but the Dog defense hit gold with a safety and two interceptions run back for TD's.


